## **Pastor's Note**

#### Dear Irondequoit UCC,

One of the biggest challenges of a preacher, especially a modern progressive preacher, is to walk the line between religion and politics. The Bible, both Old and New Testaments was extremely political in its time. When we read Isaiah preaching against Babylon, it would be as if I was to preach about the evils of China. When Jesus talks about Ceasar, it would be as if I were to directly talk about Joe Biden or Donald Trump. Furthermore, the Bible is supremely concerned with morals, ethics, and how individuals and societies should act. These concepts cannot be separated from politics.

Yet, we know that to blend politics and religion can be a very dangerous combination. The battle cry of the first Crusaders to march on Jerusalem in

1096 AD. Was *Deus le volt* or "God Wills It!" Today, many of us recognize the phrase "Allahu Akbar!" which originally was a prayer but is now the battle cry of Islamic Terrorists. It simply means, "God is Great!" Though, all authentic religions, at their core, promote peace and harmony under God, or oneness, they have all been weaponized at certain times and places to fuel anger, hatred, and division. This is the true corrupting evil, or sin, with which, as professed Christians, we must all contend. As the Apostle Paul says in Ephesian s 6:11-15 "Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Therefore, put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace."

After the increased violence in Israel, I as a preacher am faced with the dilemma of what to say, if I should say anything at all? I know that the conflict in Israel is a difficult issue, and it has a history of controversy within our own church community. However, I believe the Prophets of the Bible call all faithful people to face controversy head on and speak up against injustice wherever they see it. I also believe it is a Pastor's duty to preach the Gospel as it relates to us here and now, rather than retreating into ancient history and theology.

For this Sunday, I am being called to say something about the current conflict in Israel, while acknowledging that there are no easy answers in the face of such horrific violence, and deep division. Last week we talked about the 10 commandments, and one particular commandment seems to apply to this situation. "Thou shalt not take the Lord's Name in vain." Usually, we think of this as a minor Commandment that means do not swear and use curse words, but it also applies to religious hypocrisy. Someone who praises God while killing innocent people, is taking the Lord's name in vain in the worst way possible.

This week's lectionary also offers some striking commentary on the current situation in Israel and Palestine. The reading from Isaiah 25:1-9 could be an inspirational poem for both Palestinians and Israelis. What are we to make of scriptures like this? Finally, if we continue the lectionary readings in Exodus, we come to the story of the Golden Calf, which is all about creating false idols, (answers?) in times of anxiety.

In summary, I do not know exactly what God will call me to say this Sunday, but I encourage you to pray for the people of Israel and Palestine along with our world leaders.

# **Keeping Homeless Teens Warm This Winter**

You may recall that IUCC's Outreach Team hosted a presentation earlier this year from an organization called **SPIRIT NYS** which is working to help homeless students in the Rochester City Schools. They are supplying many forms of special assistance to provide resources that will allow the

students to successfully graduate from high school and beyond.

This year they are providing these services to approximately 55 students and they are asking for assistance from a few organizations to donate gently used or new winter clothing. Due to the sensitive nature of homelessness, they cannot supply us with specific names of the youth, but all adult sizes are helpful for males and females. The items should be appropriate for ages 16 - 19. Warm coats are the highest priority. Last year, they needed sizes small through XXL, and there were more males than females. They also are accepting hats, scarves and gloves. If they receive too many items, or things not appropriate for the youth in their program, the items will be donated to the school's clothing closet for anyone in need.

Our Outreach Team believes that this is a very worthwhile project and hope that you will consider donating one or more items. You may want to save money by looking for gently used coats at local thrift stores!

**IUCC** will be collecting the items from October 1<sup>st</sup> through November 8<sup>th</sup>. Please put the clothing items in the labeled box which will be in our Fellowship Room.

It is once again time to think about the **Salem Nutrition Center Christmas gift bags**. This year they are asking us to collect men's deodorant. There will be a box in the front hallway for them. Once again, I (Nancy Smith) will gladly shop for you. You can leave it in the office, well-marked, or just give it to me. I thank you in advance as this congregation is always so generous.

We had over 1500 Irondequoit residents come through our doors to cast their ballots, and the election workers were very pleased with our surroundings and the welcome we gave them and the voters. Some of those voters have returned to the church to worship with us!

This year we can do even more! Last year a few VERY dedicated IUCC folk welcomed voters, steered them toward the dining room where voting machines were set up, offered refreshments, and gave anyone interested some background on our amazing old building. This year we'd like to offer even more hospitality: refreshments for the polling workers; baked goods and coffee or cider for our visitors; information on all the groups that meet at IUCC and the programs we support and offer; someone to point out the restrooms. It is a long day; we will be open from 6:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m., with the workers arriving at 5:00 a.m. and leaving by 10:00 p.m. Volunteers are needed to organize refreshments, and to act as greeters and/or servers for a 2-hour day or evening shift. Other ideas you may have are welcome.

Look for the sign-up sheet in the breezeway or leave your name and contact info with Carla in the church office. The more helpers we have, the easier it is for everyone. Let's extend that extravagant welcome to our neighbors once again this November.



This training will be no more than two hours and it will involve food and fellowship. If you would like to be part of this training please sign up this Sunday.

#### What does an Usher do?

- Ready the Sanctuary to receive the community for worship. (Lighting candles, gathering bulletins, etc.)
- Greet people as they arrive. (informally)
- Collect the offering and ensure it is stored safely.
- Serve Communion to the Congregation on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of every month.
- · Help anyone who is distressed or confused.
- Sound the alarm in case of danger such as fire.
- Be a source of welcome and information for visitors.
