#### **Pastor's Note**

#### Dear Irondequoit UCC,

This has been a strange and wonderful week for our church. On Saturday we held a leadership retreat at the Stone-Tolan Historical Site. It was well attended and we learned a lot about each other, and our church, while stretching our minds and accomplishing some business too. Then we celebrated World Communion Sunday, all while mourning the loss of Carol Cowan, our beloved organist. On Monday we celebrated Carol's life and ushered her into life with music and prayer. Through all of this the hand of God was moving through our church. It was amazing how people stepped up to

help, and the things I was most worried about seemed to resolve themselves. I want to extend my deepest gratitude to all of those who contributed their time and talent to our community this past weekend.

This coming week is still busy, but much more straight forward. At the leadership retreat, one of the activities I considered was to challenge the team to list all of the different programs and people that use our building on a weekly basis. But I decided against this because it would take too long and be too difficult. For example, our building hosts at least 5 different therapists 4 types of X-Anonymous groups, and 3 scout troops.

This Sunday we will be talking about the 10 Commandments. This is the basis for the codes of laws and ethics that came to define the Jewish people. There is even a story in the Talmud (Jewish commentary) where God says, that it would be better for the people to follow the laws in Scripture and not believe in God, then for the people to believe in God and not follow the law. On this coming Sunday, and in the coming month, we will be examining own "church laws," or at least the values that bind us together as a community, and the moral principles by which we live our lives as Christians. I hope to share this dialogue with you in Church.

## **Warm This Winter**

You may recall that IUCC's Outreach Team hosted a presentation earlier this year from an organization called **SPIRIT NYS** which is working to help homeless students in the Rochester City Schools. They are supplying many forms of special assistance to provide resources that will allow the students to successfully graduate from high school and beyond.

This year they are providing these services to approximately 55 students and they are asking for assistance from a few organizations to donate gently used or new winter clothing. Due to the sensitive nature of homelessness, they cannot supply us with specific names of the youth, but all adult sizes are helpful for males and females. The items should be appropriate for ages 16 – 19. Warm coats are the highest priority. Last year, they needed sizes small through XXL, and there were more males than females. They also are accepting hats, scarves and gloves. If they receive to many items, or things not appropriate for the youth in their program, the items will be donated to the school's clothing closet for anyone in need.

Our Outreach Team believes that this is a very worthwhile project and hope that you will consider donating one or more items. You may want to save money by looking for gently used coats at local thrift stores!

**IUCC** will be collecting the items October 1<sup>st</sup> through November 8<sup>th</sup>. Please put the clothing items in the labeled box which will be in our Fellowship Room.

It is once again time to think about the **Salem Nutrition Center Christmas gift bags**. This year they are asking us to collect men's deodorant.
There will be a box in the front hallway for them. Once again, I (Nancy Smith) will gladly shop for you. You can leave in the office, well-marked,or just give it to me. I thank you in advance as this congregation is always so generous.

## Thank you Town of Irondequoit & Pastor Paul, IUCC's "Man About Town"!

IUCC got a much-needed infusion of financial support last month, mainly because our Pastor is out and about in our community. Pastor Paul had asked to meet with and get to know Town Supervisor Rory Fitzpatrick in the spring, and the two met in May. During that chat, Supervisor Fitzpatrick mentioned that there were grant funds available to qualified non-profit organizations to address the negative economic impact of the pandemic. Pastor Paul picked up on that quickly, came back to church with the application and asked the Finance Team to put together our proposal, and in July we submitted the application. In August we were notified that we had been awarded the maximum amount of \$10,000.00!

The Town summary notes that: "Non-profit groups are an important piece of the Town promoting health, safety and wellness of the community. Continuation of these programs is essential for the residents of Irondequoit." The funding is designed to replace lost revenue and/or reimburse additional expenses, both of which IUCC incurred.

These funds will go a long way to get us back into financial fighting form and will reduce our dependence on Endowment funds to offset deficits in our operating budget. We may even be able to carve out a modest amount toward a special project.

Thanks again, to our Town for supporting organizations like IUCC, and to our Pastor for his diligence in getting to know his new community!

Ushers are an essential part of our Sunday service that are deserving of respect and honor. They are the welcoming face of the church that greets visitors and ensures everyone is seated comfortably. They are the ones who watch over the congregation and help out if anyone is in distress during

the service. They collect and protect the offering and facilitate the church's most sacred ritual of Holy Communion. Ushers are the ones who "assure" the congregation that they are seen, safe, and that the service will go smoothly.

It doesn't take much time or effort to be an usher, but it does take commitment and consistency. Therefore, we will be holding our first Usher's Training this fall. This training will be no more than two hours and it will involve food and fellowship. If you would like to be part of this training please sign up this Sunday.

#### What does an Usher do?

- Ready the Sanctuary to receive the community for worship. (Lighting candles, gathering bulletins, etc.)
- Greet people as they arrive. (informally)
- Collect the offering and ensure it is stored safely.
- Serve Communion to the Congregation on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of every month.
- · Help anyone who is distressed or confused.
- Sound the alarm in case of danger such as fire.
- Be a source of welcome and information for visitors.
