


Pastor's Note

Dear Beloved IUCC,

I hope you all had a fun, safe, and happy Halloween last night! Our church celebrated the holiday on Monday night, and despite the weather it was "a rousing success." It was cold and rainy, but over 36 people came out to enjoy food, fellowship, and an occasional glimpse of fire between the downpours. In other news, Laurel has prepared us to be a welcoming place for the election, and we're beginning plans for a fabulous Advent and Christmas Season! Meanwhile we are still not quite out of the Halloween season. Today, is the hallowed day of "All Saints Day," and

tomorrow is "All Souls Day," which we will be celebrating this Sunday. Naturally, All Saints Day is mainly celebrated by Roman Catholics and other denominations that emphasize the Saints. In the UCC we do not have an official stance on the Saints one way or the other. We believe that all people are Holy Children of God, and so are in some ways saints. If you prefer, we believe that all Christians should strive to be as saintly as possible. Some protestant churches even have a theology of becoming, "sanctified," as a process after becoming Christian. Personally, I view the saints as inspirational Christian figures that we should strive to emulate. They became famous, not through displays of genius, talent, or power, but through faith, charity, and humility. Unlike Jesus, who had the advantage of being the Son of God, the Saints are fully human, yet they achieved a level of extraordinary holiness. Their lives prove that we do not have to be Christ, to be like Christ. If its too much to think about Jesus dying on the cross, you can think about St. Maximilian, who was a priest that volunteered to die in place of another man in the German death camp of Auschwitz, if that is still too daunting, think of Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, who really didn't do much. She is famous for inspiring people by, just being a very faithful, humble and loving nun in France. To me the Saints are the embodiment of the UCC modo that "God is still speaking." I believe we have plenty of Saints in the protestant Church as well, that should be lifted up as examples to emulate. New Saints are made every day, so why not you and me?



Last year was our church's first year serving as a polling site for the Monroe County Board of Elections. We had over 1500 Irondequoit residents come through our doors to cast their ballots, and the election workers were very pleased with our surroundings and the welcome we gave them and the voters. Some of those voters have returned to the church to worship with us!

This year we can do even more! Last year a few VERY dedicated IUCC folk welcomed voters, steered them toward the dining room where voting machines were set up, offered refreshments and gave anyone interested some background on our amazing old building. This year we'd like to offer even more hospitality: refreshments for the polling workers; baked goods and coffee or cider for our visitors; information on all the groups that meet at IUCC and the programs we support and offer; someone to point out the restrooms. It is a long day; we will be open from 6:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m., with the workers arriving at 5:00 a.m. and leaving by 10:00 p.m. Many volunteers have stepped up and offered to provide their time and/or goodies to share and will act as greeters and/or servers for a 2-hour day or evening shift. The more helpers we have, the easier on everyone. Looking forward to extending an extravagant welcome to our neighbors once again this November.



Honored Ushers Training!

Ushers are an essential part of our Sunday service that are deserving of respect and honor. They are the welcoming face of the church that greets visitors and ensures everyone is seated comfortably. They are the ones who watch over the congregation and help out if anyone is in distress during

the service. They collect and protect the offering and facilitate the church's most sacred ritual of Holy Communion. Ushers are the ones who "assure" the congregation that they are seen, safe, and that the service will go smoothly.

It doesn't take much time or effort to be an usher, but it does take commitment and consistency. Therefore, we will be holding our first Usher's Training this fall. This training will be no more than two hours and it will involve food and fellowship. If you would like to be part of this training please sign up this Sunday.

What does an Usher do?

- Ready the Sanctuary to receive the community for worship. (Lighting candles, gathering bulletins, etc.)
- Greet people as they arrive. (informally)
- Collect the offering and ensure it is stored safely.
- Serve Communion to the Congregation on the 1st Sunday of every month.
- · Help anyone who is distressed or confused.
- Sound the alarm in case of danger such as fire.
- Be a source of welcome and information for visitors.
