

Be Prepared - Emergency Medical Treatment at IUCC

To ensure that everyone using our facility could be helped in an emergency, we have some important tools available and wanted to make sure you are familiar with them. These tools are located in the storage cabinet on the wall opposite the main office. Call 911 immediately before proceeding with anything else. Remember that these tools need to be administered as quickly as possible to be successful and good Samaritans are protected from legal recourse if the person is hurt or dies in spite of your attempts.

- ----> We have an AED (automated external defibrillator) which is a device that can shock a stopped heart back to life. It is simple to use and there are instructions that anyone can follow.
- ----> We have doses of Narcan which are used when there is a suspected overdose. This medication is simply inserted into the person's nose like an inhaler. A second dose may be necessary if the first one is not successful. *Note: The person will not be harmed if it is administered but they are not suffering from an overdose.*




Girl Scout Troop #61028 Community Service Project to benefit IUCC Members!

Honored Ushers Training!

Ushers are an essential part of our Sunday service that are deserving of respect and honor. They are the welcoming face of the church that greets visitors and ensures everyone is seated comfortably. They are the ones who watch over the congregation and help out if anyone is in distress during

the service. They collect and protect the offering and facilitate the church's most sacred ritual of Holy Communion. Ushers are the ones who "assure" the congregation that they are seen, safe, and that the service will go smoothly.

It doesn't take much time or effort to be an usher, but it does take commitment and consistency. Therefore, we will be holding our first Usher's Training this fall. This training will be no more than two hours and it will involve food and fellowship. If you would like to be part of this training please sign up this Sunday.

What does an Usher do?

- Ready the Sanctuary to receive the community for worship. (Lighting candles, gathering bulletins, etc.)
- Greet people as they arrive. (informally)
- Collect the offering and ensure it is stored safely.
- Serve Communion to the Congregation on the 1st Sunday of every month.
- · Help anyone who is distressed or confused.
- Sound the alarm in case of danger such as fire.
- Be a source of welcome and information for visitors.
